#### General:

- The form must be completed in full using **BLOCK CAPITALS** and writing must be legible.
- Use a black ballpoint pen.
- Photocopies are not acceptable.
- Provide the necessary documents to verify your identity, totaling **100** + **points** as per the *Garda Vetting Identification Check* form provided.
- If the applicant is under 18 years of age, a completed **NVB 3** 'Parent\Guardian Consent Form' will be required as well. Please note that where the applicant is under 18 years of age the electronic correspondence will be issued directly to the /Guardian. Therefore, do provide the Parent \ Guardian email address on the NVB 1 form.

#### **Details:**

- Insert your details in each field, allowing one block letter / digit per box, leave an open box for a space.
- For 'Email Address': allow one character / symbol per box. An invitation to the e-vetting website will be sent to this address.
- 'Role Being Vetted For': this is pre-populated' for your convenience.
- 'Current Address': the address where you are presently residing. Complete in full, including Eircode / Postcode no abbreviations.

### Garda Vetting 100-point identification check <sup>1</sup>

The National Vetting (Children and Vulnerable Persons) Act 2012 to 2016 makes it a legal requirement to vet those involved in work or activity, where they will have regular access to or contact with children or vulnerable adults.

This information sheet has been developed to support organisations in verifying the identity of vetting subjects (those applying to be Garda Vetted). When conducting Garda Vetting, organisations should require volunteers or workers to present identification totaling 100 points to ensure they are checking the correct person. <sup>2</sup> At least one form of photographic evidence must be gathered.

This document has not been approved by any external agency, body or authority and is only intended as a guide to verifying an individual's identity in Ireland.

<sup>&</sup>lt;sup>2</sup> If a vetting subject doesn't have any of these forms of ID or does not reach the 100-point mark with ID that they have – they can go to a commissioner of Oaths and swear as to their name, address and date of birth. This then becomes a legally binding document that can serve as a valid form of ID for compliance purposes.
